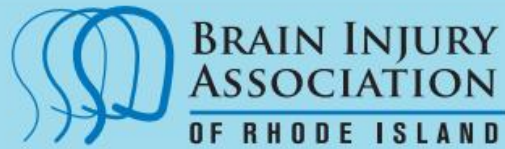
EMERGENCY ACTION PLANS

HEAT ACCLIMATIZATION & HYDRATION

In preparation for the fall preseason, school administrators, athletic directors, coaches and staff members are reminded of the importance of activity and practice modifications. THIS IS NOT JUST A FOOTBALL ISSUE. Any student participating in an outdoor sport or activity in the heat is vulnerable to heat illness, including participants in activities such as marching band, cheer and also volleyball players practicing in hot gyms without air conditioning.



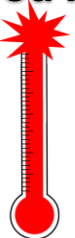
It is crucial that heat acclimatizing guidelines are strictly followed, especially during the first 3-4 days of the practices.

This is the time when our students are most vulnerable to the heat.

Did You Know?



This is the peak time of the year for risk of heat-related illnesses and deaths. Nationally, during the last 10-year period, the National Center for Catastrophic Sport Injury Research (NCCSIR) captured a total of 42 exertional heat stroke events in high school athletes (29 football, 6 cross country, 3 soccer, 3 basketball, and 1 cheer). Of these 42 exertional heat stroke events, 18 (42.9%) athletes died (15 football, 2 basketball, and 1 soccer).



COLD WATER IMMERSION TUBS

The RIIL SMAC recommends that Cold Water Immersion Tubs be on site for warm weather activities.



In the event of Exertional Heat Stroke (EHS), the primary goal is to cool the patient immediately and as rapidly as possible. The most effective way to decrease core body temperature is full-body cold water immersion (CWI) in a pool or tub.

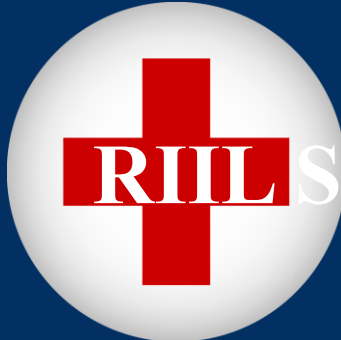

School Responsibilities to the Membership

PRIORITY

1. All Coaches shall be appointed by the Athletic Director on the RIIL website, upload all required certificates prior to the season start date, and be "Verified" by the Athletic Director
 - a. Maintain list of current Coaches, Administrators, and Athletic Director(s) on the RIIL website
 - b. [Rhode Island General Law \(RIGL\) 16-11.1](#):
 - i. Athletic Coaches (Requirement for CPR, First Aid, Pre-Season Lecture)
 - c. [RIGL 16-2-18.1](#): Criminal Records Review (Requirement for BCI Check for Coaches)
 - d. [RIGL 16-91.1](#): Sudden Cardiac Arrest Prevention (Requirement for Cardiac Arrest Training)
 - e. [RIGL 16-21.4](#): Performance-Enhancing Drug Prevention (Requirement for Communication)
 - f. [RIGL 16-91](#): School Programs Concussion Act (Requirement for Concussion Training)
 - g. [RIGL 40-11-3.3](#): Mandatory Reporting (Requirement for Mandatory Reporting of Abuse)
 - h. [NFHS Essential Legal Duties for Athletic Directors and Coaches](#)
2. Student-Athletes cleared for Eligibility
 - a. **Please note that Student-Athlete Eligibility is the most complicated issue within the RIIL.**
 - i. RIIL Member Schools voluntarily agree to universal residency, academic, and eligibility standards for student-athletes to ensure that every student is participating in our education-based athletic programs by the same set of rules.
 - ii. Students cannot participate in practices or contests before they are cleared by administration.
 - iii. The Checklist below is intended to guide administrators in determining athletic eligibility based on the most common situations and is not representative of every rule contained in the R&R.
 - iv. Please contact the RIIL Office with any question, no matter how small.
 - b. Determining Eligibility for Student-Athletes:
 - i. Member Schools should hold athletic sign-ups prior to each athletic season to provide athletic administrators ample time to determine eligibility.
 1. Fall Registration: Early June, Winter: Mid-October, & Spring: Early February
 - ii. Academic Eligibility (RIIL R&R Article 3, Section 4.B) (3-4.B):

1. Student-Athletes must pass 60% of their courses in the previous marking period including every course a student is enrolled in. (3-4.A)
 - a. Incompletes that remain 2 (or 3) weeks after the end of a marking period are considered Failures for determining Athletic Eligibility. (3-4.B.2)
- iii. School-based Eligibility:
 1. Athletes must be legally enrolled at the school for which they participate (3-1-F.1.a)
 2. Athletes must reside at the same address as a legally recognized parent/guardian (3-6-D)
 3. Athletes must submit an RIIL Assumption of Risk Form prior to participation. (3-1.B)
 - a. Must be completed once during the student's career at a high school
 - b. Originals of the Assumption of Risk Forms must be kept on file at the school
 4. Athletes must submit the RIIL Concussion Form signed by the Parent and Student
 - a. [RIGL 16-91](#): School Programs Concussion Act (RIIL Parent Concussion Form)
 5. Athletes should have a pre-participation athletic physical within school/district/state guidelines and be cleared by the school nurse/doctor or other medical professional prior to participation. (1-2.C)
 6. All additional forms required by the school district must be completed and reviewed by administration prior to participation.
- iv. Athletes are Automatically **Ineligible** for athletics at an RIIL Member School If:
 1. The student is **not** residing at the same address as a parent or legal guardian. (3-6-D)
 - a. More information and additional conversations are needed
 - b. Contact the RIIL Office immediately to determine eligibility
 2. The student's 19th birthday occurs prior to September 1st. (3-5-A)
 - a. For the current school year, the student's 19th birthday must be after September 1st to be eligible for athletics at an RIIL Member School.
 3. The student has already completed Eight Consecutive Semesters (four consecutive school years) in high school from their first date of enrollment in the 9th grade at ANY high school. (3-5-B)
- v. Unique Eligibility Scenarios
 1. Schools should add a registration form or develop a process with Guidance to automatically notify the Athletic Department when a new student enrolls after the first day of 9th grade to easily identify Transfers.
 - a. Intra-School Notification of Transfers (including bonafide moves) through:
 - i. Online Registration – add a section to identify transfers
 - ii. Paper Registration – add a required form to identify transfers

 - a. If YES, complete the RIIL online Transfer Management System.
4. Is the student a Foreign-Exchange Student? (3-7)
 - a. If YES, complete a RIIL Foreign Exchange Form.
5. Is the student Home-Schooled? (3-1.H)
 - a. If YES, the student must be listed as an enrolled student with district administration and written approval of the student's home school education plan must be provided to the Principal by district administration.
6. Is the student enrolled at an Alternative Member School? (3-2)
 - a. If YES, the receiving school must be provided with the following documentation from the Alternative Member School:
 - i. Alternative Member Student-Athlete Eligibility Form
 - ii. Completed Assumption of Risk Form
 - iii. Valid Physical Form

c. After all the above criteria have been met, the student can participate in their first day of practice and be added to the eligibility list.

RIIAAA & RIIL Sub-Varsity Sports Regulations

1. At the request of the RIIAAA, the RIIL will institute the following regulations pertaining to Sub-Varsity Programs:
 - a. Sub-Varsity sports are developmental in nature and the goal is to provide students the opportunity to participate and improve their skill level through game competition.
 - b. Individual schools will post Junior Varsity games to their online schedule.
 - c. Schools will have the opportunity to confirm Junior Varsity games and make changes (additions, date/time changes, cancellations, etc.) prior to the established commit dates
2. **All Sub-Varsity games are non-league.**
3. Regular season SUB-VARSITY schedules and all Tournaments in ALL sports **must** be listed on the RIIL website.
4. **All Coaches Association sponsored SUB-VARSITY end-of-year Tournaments must be approved by the RIIAAA Executive Board in order to be sanctioned by the RIIL and RIIAAA Member Schools**
5. Playoffs/Tournaments:
 - a. It is the host school's responsibility to post all Junior Varsity Playoff or Tournament games on their RIIL online schedule.
 - b. RIIL Officials must be assigned online by the Assigner through the normal process.
 - c. In sports where playoffs are scheduled—they **must** be held at the conclusion of the SUB-VARSITY regular season.
 - d. All SUB-VARSITY Playoffs or Tournaments must occur on a single day or weekend unless approved otherwise.
 - e. Regular-season sub-varsity records cannot be used to seed teams for a tournament.
 - f. All teams must have the opportunity to participate.
 - g. Sub-Varsity Post-seasons must be concluded by the end of the varsity regular season unless approved otherwise.

RULES SPOTLIGHT

POSTPONEMENT & RESCHEDULING OF GAMES

- A. Where unusual circumstances prevail or where weather conditions are unfavorable, a game may be postponed by mutual consent of the Principals, or Athletic Directors.
- B. By mutual availability of the schools involved and confirmation of facility/officials availability, postponed games shall be rescheduled to the next day (including weekends and/or school vacations).

Article 4, Section 2

RULES SPOTLIGHT

GAME SUPERVISION

The home team is to be held responsible for conditions involving spectators and shall always have present an authorized representative of the school to take this responsibility.

1. An adult game supervisor must be present at ice hockey, basketball, field hockey, lacrosse, baseball, softball, football, soccer, volleyball and wrestling contests. The supervisor shall not be a student nor a coach involved with the game. The supervisor shall identify himself or herself to the game officials thirty (30) minutes prior to the start of the game. The supervisor shall be responsible for game administration and crowd control. In the event of a problem, he/she must notify the RIIL office the next day and submit a written report detailing the incident(s).
2. Where necessary, police protection should be present, and no hesitation exercised in ejecting from any school game any spectator, or group of spectators, whose conduct cannot be controlled by a warning, and whose further presence is prejudicial to the interest and/or outcome of the game.

RIIL RULES & REGULATIONS

ARTICLE 13 – COACHING REQUIREMENT

Section 1. Coaches Certification

Member school Principals or their designee are responsible for ensuring that all coaches, paid or unpaid at all levels (Varsity, Sub-Varsity, and **Volunteers) meet the RIIL Coaching Requirements.**

All Head Coaches, Assistant Coaches, and Volunteer Coaches must be in compliance with the Initial Certification Requirements outlined in Article 13.

RULES SPOTLIGHT

SCORE REPORTING

ALL scores, including Varsity, Junior Varsity, Freshmen, and Middle School must be reported

- A. Game Score Reports: All RIIL league contest scores are to be reported on-line on the RIIL Website. Coaches obtain access to the system through their AD.
- 1) The home team shall report scores within 48 hours of the end of the contest
 - 3) Penalty: Failure to report scores will result in a twenty-dollar (\$20.00) fine for each contest not reported. Schools will be billed at the end of the season

MaxPreps is the industry leading platform that provides schools with various desktop, tablet, and mobile options to keep their team information accurate.

Frequently Asked Questions

- 1. What RIIIL initiatives will MaxPreps data power?** MaxPreps is the Official Partner for Sports Statistics to the RIIIL. All information entered into MaxPreps will be sent to the RIIIL to manage stat leaderboards and much more. In order to manage these initiatives, all RIIIL member schools are strongly recommended to enter their team statistics after each game.
- 2. Where do I enter my schedule, score and roster?** Each member school will continue to enter their schedules and scores into the RIIIL administrative platform, and that data will be sent to MaxPreps to be displayed on your team pages. Each member school will then be responsible for updating their stats on MaxPreps after each game throughout the season.
- 3. What do Athletic Directors need to do?** Since RIIIL member schools need to keep accurate stats on MaxPreps, the AD needs to ensure each team coaching staff has access to enter stats. ADs or any coaches currently not using MaxPreps should contact MaxPreps at 800-329-7324 x1 or support@maxpreps.com to sign up or get access.
- 4. Which sports are included in the partnership?** MaxPreps provides a complete stats platform for nearly all the sports the RIIIL offers.
- 5. How do I sign up to get access to my administrative account on MaxPreps for the first time?** Athletic Directors/Coaches can follow [this link on MaxPreps](#) to become a free MaxPreps member and follow the prompts to gain access to your team. Make sure to select "Head Coach or Athletic Director" as your role for the team.
- 6. Can Athletic Directors control their MaxPreps team pages?** Yes! Athletic Directors can control every single team from their free School Administration page on MaxPreps.
- 7. Can coaches allow a team statistician or assistant coach to help manage their team information?** Yes! Once the coach has access to their team admin page, they can give other individuals access to their page to help keep their team information accurate.
- 8. Is MaxPreps compatible with other stat programs?** In addition to MaxPreps own mobile, tablet, and desktop tools, MaxPreps is compatible with over 80 different stat companies across multiple sports. [Click here to view MaxPreps stat partners.](#)
- 9. Does MaxPreps have an app to manage team information?** Yes! Our MaxPreps app is available to download for both iPhone and Android devices at maxpreps.com/apps. ADs and Coaches can update complete schedules, rosters, scores and stats, and also sync their game schedule to their phone's calendar, and more.

Regular-season Media Reminders

Regular-season games are under the jurisdiction of host schools. Media credentials issued by the RIIL are for RIIL Tournament events ONLY. Therefore, our office instructs anyone requesting media/sideline access at regular-season games to obtain permission through the athletic director and/or school administrator of the host school.

As such, you as the host school have the authority to set the rules regarding the areas you want photographers, journalists and any other media members to have access to (i.e. sidelines, press box, stands, etc) based on your school district's policies and guidelines.

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Media credentials issued by the RIIL are for RIIL Tournament events ONLY. They are issued to appropriate persons employed by, and responsible to, recognized media entities.

With regard to requests by photographers, videographers, etc. who are shooting for a particular school . . . Each member school will be issued two (2) green credentials and they may issue these passes to individuals such as the ones described above at their discretion. Individuals in this category who contact the RIIL office will be referred back to the school they are working with.



- Proper use of school media passes during tournament time is the responsibility of the school.
- Passes must be signed by the Principal.
- School is verifying that individuals representing the school have been properly vetted.
- Pass holders are expected to exhibit professional behavior, respect student privacy and accept accountability for his/her actions while covering RIIL events.
- The RIIL may deny or revoke credentials for noncompliance with RIIL media_policies.
