

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

Participation in High School Sports Hits Record High in 2024-25

High school athletics participation increased by more than 200,000 in 2024-25, continuing an upward trajectory since the pandemic and registering an all-time high for participation. The NFHS High School Athletics Participation Survey indicated that 8,266,244 participants were involved in high school sports in 2024-25, which is up 203,942 from the previous year and tops the previous record of 8,062,302 set in 2023-24. The total includes 4,726,648 boys and 3,539,596 girls – both record highs – according to figures obtained from the 51 NFHS member state associations, which includes the District of Columbia.

The 2024-25 total marked the third consecutive notable increase after numbers fell during the pandemic. Since the initial survey after the pandemic, participation in high school sports has increased more than 645,000 in three years and represents a turnaround from the decline that started the year before the COVID-19 pandemic. “It is wonderful to see the interest in high school sports reach new heights,” said Dr. Karissa Niehoff, CEO of the NFHS. “The immense value of high school sports is reflected in these impressive numbers. As high school students have consistently demonstrated

their desire to play with their peers and represent their schools and community, state and school administrators have stepped up to offer more participation opportunities to meet that demand.”

The biggest gains in 2024-25 were mainly found in girls sports, with flag football leading the way. The rapid rise of girls flag football programs across the country led to 68,847 girls participating in the sport last year – an impressive 60 percent increase from the previous year. In addition, schools sponsoring the sport increased by nearly 1,000.

Girls wrestling topped 74,000 participants for the first time, jumping 15 percent from a year ago and adding nearly 1,000 schools with a girls wrestling program. Boys wrestling participation is also enjoying a rebound in numbers, recording an increase of 8,340 to top 300,000 for the first time.

The number of participants in Unified Sports and Esports also registered increases in 2024-25. The survey indicated a total of 70,006 participants in the 15 Unified Sports, up from 51,502 in 2023-24. A total of 30,440 students participated in Esports last year – an increase of 2,939 participants from the previous year.

Outdoor track and field, volleyball and soccer all registered increases and remained the top three participatory sports for girls. Track and field participation increased to 513,808, followed by volleyball at 492,799 (up 2.85%) and soccer at 393,048 (up 2.38%).

Basketball (356,240) remained in the No. 4 spot followed by fast-pitch softball (331,306). Competitive spirit (206,262) jumped to the sixth-most popular girls sport with a nearly 14-percent increase, while tennis (204,721) also increased by more than four percent. Cross country (191,733), swimming and diving (138,303) and lacrosse (99,292) round out the top 10.

Outdoor track and field, soccer and golf had significant gains on the boys side, and all 10 of the most popular sports held steady or registered gains. After 11-player football (1,029,588) and outdoor track and field (644,235), the rest of the boys top 10 includes basketball (540,704), soccer (484,908), baseball (472,598), wrestling (300,214), cross country (241,565), golf (162,357), tennis (158,667) and swimming and diving (119,102).

Texas (879,403) and California (852,575) remained atop the list of state participation. Ohio (335,808) jumped to third, followed by Pennsylvania (333,123), Illinois (328,362), New York (327,068) Florida (308,396), Michigan (298,246), New Jersey (281,971) and Minnesota (232,347).

The NFHS High School Athletics Participation Survey was started in 1971 and was compiled in its current form through the 2018-19 school year, resuming annually with the 2021-22 survey. ATHLETIC DIRECTOR ROLES & RESPONSIBILITIES



School Responsibilities to the Membership

1. All Coaches shall be appointed by the Athletic Director on the RIIL website, upload all required certificates prior to the season start date, and be “Verified” by the Athletic Director
2. Student-Athletes cleared for Eligibility
3. Health & Safety
4. Schedules Confirmed
5. Rosters posted online and updated when students are added/removed from a team
6. Seasonal Requests submitted prior to each deadline



ELIGIBILITY LIST

- Eligibility Lists must be filled within 10 days of the start date each sports season:
 - **Winter 2025 Deadline: Thursday, December 11th**
- To further protect schools and administrators:
 - *All Head Coaches must use the Official Rosters posted on the RIIL website for any game-related purpose.*
 - We are asking Athletic Directors and Officials to help enforce.

ELIGIBILITY

BEFORE ANY STUDENT IS ALLOWED TO PARTICIPATE IN A GAME, THEY MUST BE PROPERLY CLEARED FOR ELIGIBILITY BY ALL RIIL RULES & REGULATIONS AND ANY ADDITIONAL SCHOOL REQUIREMENTS

- Enrollment
- Assumption of risk forms
- Medical clearance
- Age
- Semester Limit
- Academics
- Transfers
- CTE Pathways
- Alternative schools



If a student-athlete arrives at the first day of practice without the proper clearance, they should not be allowed to participate! Send student to your school administration.



SCHEDULING

- **ALL GAMES MUST BE ENTERED ON THE RIIL WEBSITE**
 - Officials can be viewed by Athletic Directors in Arbiter
 - JV tournaments must be sent to the league for officials to be assigned
- **NEUTRAL SITE SEMIFINAL DATES:**
 - Basketball: Division Semifinals on February 25, 26, 27
 - Six sites needed to cover B&G Divisions
 - Deadline: Thursday, January 15th

RULES SPOTLIGHT

POSTPONEMENT & RESCHEDULING OF GAMES

- A. Where unusual circumstances prevail or where weather conditions are unfavorable, a game may be postponed by mutual consent of the Principals, or Athletic Directors.
- B. By mutual agreement of the schools involved, confirmation of official's availability, and facility availability postponed games shall be rescheduled to the next day (including weekends and/or school vacations).

Article 4, Section 2.

RULES SPOTLIGHT

Game Supervision

The home team is to be held responsible for conditions involving spectators and shall always have present an authorized representative of the school to take this responsibility.

1. An adult game supervisor must be present at ice hockey, basketball, field hockey, lacrosse, baseball, softball, football, soccer, volleyball and wrestling contests. The supervisor shall not be a student nor a coach involved with the game. The supervisor shall identify himself or herself to the game officials thirty (30) minutes prior to the start of the game. The supervisor shall be responsible for game administration and crowd control. In the event of a problem, he/she must notify the RIIL office the next day and submit a written report detailing the incident(s).
2. Where necessary, police protection should be present, and no hesitation exercised in ejecting from any school game any spectator, or group of spectators, whose conduct cannot be controlled by a warning, and whose further presence is prejudicial to the interest and/or outcome of the game.

NFHS Winter Sports Officials Appreciation Week – January 11-17, 2026

Suggested ways to show appreciation:

- Officials' appreciation week banners and signage on the fence, wall, etc., surrounding the contest playing area.
- Gift cards/cookies/donuts/other items presented to the crew by both the home and visiting team.
- Photos of the officiating crew with both teams and coaches prior to the start of the game (or at the end, depending on timing).
- Read a PSA at the start of the game, thanking the crew for working the contest.
- Student escorts of the crew onto the field/court/pitch.
- "Thank you" cards, signed by the team and coaching staff.
- Special appreciation signage in the officials' locker room.
- Recorded "thank you" messages from student-athletes and coaches to officials, posted on social media.
- These are just some examples of what schools can do – the possibilities are endless!





SPORTSMANSHIP

A coaches' actions, attitude, and words are the determining factor in how their student-athletes will interact with teammates, opponents, officials, and spectators during interscholastic events.

RIIL RULES & REGULATIONS

ARTICLE 12 - SPORTSMANSHIP

COACH

The coach plays a critical role in supporting and enhancing good sportsmanship. The coach must accept primary responsibility for the behavior and actions of his/her players and assistant coaches, **during and after all games**. The coach serves as a role model for his/her players, their parents and the spectators. The coach must always be in control, practice sound values and ethics and always pursue victory with honor.

1. Will model ethics and sportsmanship, always pursue victory with honor and maintain dignity and self-control.
2. Shall stay informed about sound coaching techniques and the physical, mental, and emotional development of the student-athlete.
3. Will teach players the rules of the game and to respect the game, officials, and opponents and will take action when athletes exhibit poor sportsmanship.
4. Will place the academic, emotional, physical and moral well being of student-athletes above desires and pressures to win.
5. Will be an ambassador for sport among athletes, schools, families and the community.
6. Will abide by the rules of the game and RIIL in letter and spirit.
7. Shall exemplify high moral character, behavior and leadership, lead by example and set a standard for players and spectators to follow.
8. Will respect the integrity and judgment of game officials.



- Emergency Action Plans are required by RI Law and must be reviewed with Coaches
 - AED locations
 - Pregame Safety Card is highly encouraged
- REAP Concussion Management Program was created in partnership with the BIARI and is recommended to all schools
 - Coaches have the primary responsibility for safety of their students
 - Students must be removed when exhibiting symptoms
 - Only Athletic Trainers and authorized medical professionals can legally determine if a student can return to play (refer to the chart on slide 40)



EMERGENCY ACTION PLANS

*As you plan for the start of fall sports and activities, coaches are encouraged to make sure that there is an **Emergency Action Plan** in place for their team and that the plan is reviewed and practiced with the players, coaches, staff and athletic trainers to ensure a quick response in the event of an emergency.*



All Events:

- 1. Are all student-athletes eligible to participate and legally equipped by all NFHS and RIIL Rules?**
- 2. Are all Coaches present at the game certified by RIIL Standards?**
- 3. Identify the designated game administrator in charge of dealing with unsportsmanlike actions during the event. Where will they be located during the game?**
- 4. Is there an Emergency Action Plan in place for the specific facility where the game is being played? Are the Game Administrator and home team Head Coach aware of the EAP and capable of executing it in the event of an emergency?**
- 5. Is there an Automated External Defibrillator (AED) available and easily accessible.
If Yes, identify the location.**
- 6. Is there a designated health care provider on-site (MD, DO, NP, PA, AT, EMT) who can evaluate an injured athlete?**

Outdoor Events:

- 7. Is there a plan in place for potential weather issues, such as lightning, excessive heat, or shelter in place?
Who is responsible for monitoring the weather?**



ARTICLE 13 – COACHING REQUIREMENT

Section 1. Coaches Certification

Member school Principals or their designee are responsible for ensuring that all coaches, paid or unpaid at all levels (Varsity, Sub-Varsity, and Volunteers) meet the RIIL Coaching Requirements.

All Head Coaches, Assistant Coaches, and Volunteer Coaches must be in compliance with the Initial Certification Requirements outlined in Article 13.

Article 6, Section 14. MANDATORY GAME SCORE REPORTS AND COACHES REGISTRATION

LIMITATION OF SEASONS ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

Coaching Students in the Off Season During the Academic Year

The RIIL is committed to the philosophy of encouraging students to participate in multiple high school sports throughout the academic year. The interpretation of, and compliance with Article 7 of the rules and regulations of the Rhode Island Interscholastic League shall be in both letter and spirit.

Purpose:

- To allow students to seek informal and individualized extra help from high school coaches in the same way teachers may provide extra help for a student academically.
- To define allowable out of season individual instruction during the academic year between coaches and students that is consistent with the philosophy of encouraging multi-sport participation on high school teams.
- The letter and spirit of these rules are not intended to create an incentive for students to opt out of other high school sports to specialize in a single sport.
- Coaches are prohibited from coaching current and/or prospective students enrolled in their school on non-school teams or any other sport specific coaching activity during the academic year outside of their assigned sport season unless otherwise specified below.
- These are minimum standards and the RIIL will support schools that choose to institute a higher standard.

Coaches

- May only participate voluntarily and without financial gain or compensation.
- May participate in informal and individualized instruction with no more than three (3) high school students at any one time or in any one facility.
- May participate in informal and individualized instruction with any one (1) student for a maximum of three (3) hours per week. Regularly scheduled instruction is not within the spirit of these rules.
- Informal and individualized instruction is open to all students enrolled in the school and eligible to participate by all RIIL eligibility rules and regulations.
- All informal and individualized instruction must be sanctioned and approved in advance by the school




Media credentials issued by the RIIL are for RIIL Tournament events ONLY. They are issued to appropriate persons employed by, and responsible to, recognized media entities.

With regard to requests by photographers, videographers, etc. who are shooting for a particular school . . . Each member school will be issued two (2) green credentials and they may issue these passes to individuals such as the ones described above at their discretion. Individuals in this category who contact the RIIL office will be referred back to the school they are working with.



- Proper use of school media passes during tournament time is the responsibility of the school.
- Passes must be signed by the Principal.
